Lola enlists her classmates in trying to win a recycling competition in which the prize is a live tree to plant.

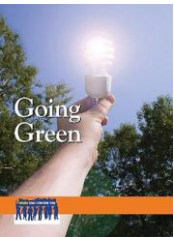

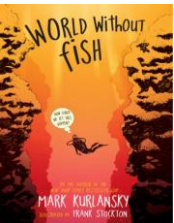
