Phyllis Reynolds Naylor's first children's book, "The Galloping Goat and Other Stories," was published in 1965. She has written more than 125 books for children and teens. In 1992, she was awarded the Newbery Medal for "Shiloh." To complete the trilogy, she released "Shiloh Season" and "Saving Shiloh." Each book was turned into a successful movie.

Other books by Naylor include the "Alice" series, "Cat Pack" series, "The Boys Start the War" series, "The Witch Saga" series and the "Bessledorf" mysteries. Each series features the challenges of children overcoming adversity while learning to understand their individual strengths.

Join Naylor as she receives the 2010 Anne V. Zarrow Award for Young Readers' Literature on Friday, Aug. 27 at 7 p.m. at Central Library. She will speak about her life and works, and answer questions.

You also are invited to the awards ceremony for the 2010 Young People's Creative Writing Contest on Saturday, Aug. 28 at 10 a.m. at Hardesty Regional Library. Naylor will hand out awards to contest winners and talk about her experiences writing award-winning books.

Naylor will sign books at both events. Copies of her works will be available for purchasing.
